AN ARCHAEOLOGICAL EPIC UNRAVELS THE MYSTERIES OF EGYPT'S SUNKEN CITY

3,000 years ago, at the mouth of the Nile, stood a sumptuous, cosmopolitan and thriving port city: Thonis-Heracleion, symbol of the power and glory of ancient Egypt. Swallowed up by the waters of the Mediterranean in the 2^{nd} century BC following a series of natural disasters, the city became a distant legend... until an exceptional discovery was made in the early 2000s.

In 2001, explorer Franck Goddio and his team brought archaeological remains to the surface of the Abu Qir Bay, including a two-meter stele. Since then, they have been exhuming treasures year after year - each more fascinating than the last. Today, we are embarking on one of the last expeditions of this prodigious mission.

With exclusive access to the current excavations, and thanks to the recent digitization of underwater archives and 3D reconstruction, this archaeological and scientific epic will bring this Egyptian Atlantis back to life and unravel its enduring mysteries.

THE PURSUIT OF KHUFU'S FUNERARY TREASURE

COULD THE FUNERARY TREASURE OF KHUFU STILL BE LYING BENEATH THE GREAT PYRAMID?

Impressive and majestic, the Great Pyramid of Giza, the only one of the Seven Wonders of the World still standing, has towered over Egypt for centuries. But a mystery remains: this colossal pyramid appears to be empty. Neither King Khufu's mummy nor his treasure have ever been found.

After researchers claimed to have found an "underground city" 600 meters deep beneath the pyramids of Giza in March 2025, the question arises: Could the tomb of Khufu be hidden under the Great pyramid - built during his reign?

Following the course of the Nile with leading international experts, and retracing the steps of the most iconic pharaohs, we set out in search of the treasure of Khufu. We will explore the king's pyramid, its interior, and iconic tombs, with the idea of a hidden treasure in the background, whose contours and location will be discussed with archaeological and editorial rigor.

BABYLON: THE TOWER TO THE HEAVENS

UNCOVER THE ARCHITECTURAL FEAT BEHIND THE MYTHICAL TOWER OF BABEL

In the second millennium BCE, in the heart of Babylon, the most famous city from ancient Mesopotamia, King Hammurabi launched a colossal project: the construction of the Etemenanki ziggurat, a gigantic tower intended to link the world of men with that of the gods.

Spanning over a thousand years of construction, this monument was a triumph of architecture and engineering: 90 meters wide by 90 meters high, seven levels crowned with a temple of six chapels, and visible from dozens of kilometers away. A symbol of Babylon's power, the Etemenanki inspired the biblical tale of the Tower of Babel - and ultimately shared its tragic fate.

But where does the universal myth end, and where does historical truth begin? With the insights of international experts, and thanks to 3D modeling and Algenerated animations, this film attempts to unravel the secrets of the tallest tower in all Antiquity, and of the legendary megacity that raised it.

LOOKING BACK ON THE ULTIMATE JOURNEY OF AN ICONIC ERA THAT SHAPED A GENERATION

Between the mid-1950s and the late 1970s, hundreds of thousands of young Westerners set off by car, bus or even hitchhiking, on a 6,000-kilometer journey to Kathmandu. Belonging to the last generation of the baby boom, these backpackers longed to leave behind their parents' world, dominated by consumerism, colonialism, and the looming shadow of war.

THE GENIUS COUPLE WHO SECRETLY CREATED THE FRENCH ATOMIC BOMB

The story of the French atomic bomb is one of the Republic's best-kept secrets. Behind this epic story, which began with the discovery of artificial radioactivity and culminated in the dropping of the first French atomic bomb in Algeria, lies a couple of geniuses: Irène and Frédéric Joliot-Curie.

It's an extraordinary adventure, rarely told, spanning the tormented years between the wars, the Second World War and the Cold War, with its division of the world into two blocs. BETWEEN RUINS AND REBIRTH, HOLOCAUST SURVIVORS TURNED EXILE INTO THE FRAGILE BEGINNING OF A NEW LIFE

In 1945, the liberation of the Nazi camps did not mean freedom. Hundreds of thousands of Holocaust survivors, unwilling or unable to return to their countries of origin, found themselves confined in DPC - displaced persons camps - often on the very soil of their former persecutors.

These places of waiting, marked by uncertainty and the world's indifference, nevertheless became centers of rebirth. Families were rebuilt, schools, newspapers, and theaters were created. Birth rates soared, cultural life thrived, and solidarity restored a sense of dignity to the survivors, preparing for new lives in Palestine, the United States, or elsewhere...

How does one learn to live again after extermination while antisemitism still raged? Drawing from rare archives and powerful testimonies, this documentary sheds light on a forgotten chapter of collective memory: the reconstruction of a people amid the ruins.



THE TRUE STORY OF PRIVATE RYAN

THE REAL AND UNTOLD STORY BEHIND SPIELBERG'S CLASSIC

In 1998, Spielberg's classic *Saving Private Ryan* was released in theaters. Its opening scene instantly became iconic: never before had the D-Day landings been depicted with such brutality, realism and closeness to the men plunged into the heart of chaos.

Behind this gripping fiction lies a true story, little-known to the public: that of four American brothers swept up by World War II - the Niland brothers. Their family tragedy, every bit as moving as the story imagined by Steven Spielberg, is entirely real - and in this reality, war surpasses fiction.

THE INSIDE STORY OF THE YOUNG MEN WHO ACCEPTED THE ULTIMATE SACRIFICE

During the Pacific War, special units of the Japanese Army organized suicide missions in an attempt to halt the US Navy's advance toward Japan. In total, no fewer than 4,000 pilots would plunge their planes into American ships at the cost of their lives.

Since the 1930s, militarist culture had permeated Japanese society and its soldiers. On this fertile ground, a subtle form of conditioning enabled the psychological subjugation of many young men during the Second World War. The kamikaze mission quickly became central to Japan's counteroffensive. It would last ten months, up to the very last day of the war.

Blending previously unseen archives, letters, poems, and wills written by pilots just before their ultimate mission, as well as the written accounts of those who survived, this documentary evokes the sacrifice of these kamikaze pilots in the name of a war lost from the start and tells the story from within of this little-known, large-scale operation.

THE STORY OF A VIRTUOSA WHO BROKE BARRIERS FOR WOMEN IN ART

17th-century Bologna stood apart from other Italian cities by the place it allowed women in society, defying the conventions of the time. The city boasted three times as many professional women artists as either Rome or Venice, and twice as many as Florence. What's more, not all of them came from elite families. What made this sort of progress possible here, and not elsewhere?

At the time, one young Bolognese woman painter broke into a field long dominated by men: history painting - considered the most prestigious genre of all. Through technical skill, and a network of intellectuals and patrons, Elisabetta Sirani drew commissions from across Europe. A true pioneer who died prematurely at the young age of 27, her work - long overlooked - is now being brought back into the public eye.

Blending animation, rare archival material, and interviews with experts, this documentary reveals how a unique cultural setting and an extraordinary individual converged to challenge the social order and pave the way for women's emancipation.

THE WORLD'S GREATEST CULTURAL MEGASTRUCTURE IS ON THE BRINK OF CHANGE



When Ayatollah Khomeini came to power in 1979, Iran was cast out of the international community: its nuclear program was shut down, its assets frozen, and Western nations distanced themselves. As a response, Iran organized the kidnapping in Beirut of Western nationals with the help of its Lebanese allies.

Held captive, and tortured for years, the hostages became leverage in a shadow war that mobilized every Western intelligence service. The series explores how Iran manipulated these abductions to gain advantage at the negotiating table.



IS NATURAL HYDROGEN REALLY THE ENERGY OF THE FUTURE?


Over the past few years, hydrogen has become a real social issue, with more and more reports on the subject and its use spreading in both transport and aerospace. But while its industrial production comes at the cost of heavy pollution, the discovery of natural hydrogen reservoirs around the world is raising hopes of an energy transition away from fossil fuels.

But what do we really know about this gas? What role does it play in the cycle of life? Is it a finite or renewable resource? Sometimes described as a miracle solution to the climate crisis, sometimes as an ecological mirage, natural hydrogen is above all a mystery, for the general public and researchers alike.

The race is on to expand our knowledge on hydrogen, before the industry gets hold of it. Current scientific missions promise a better understanding of our planet's mechanisms, at a time when it is crucial to reconcile the exploitation of resources with the preservation of living organisms.

XENOGRAFTS: THE FUTURE OF SCIENCE?

WITH THE LACK OF DONORS, XENOTRANSPLANTATION CAN BE A SOLUTION TO SAVE MORE HUMAN LIVES

In 2022, surgeons at the University of Maryland Medical School achieved a medical miracle with the first successful transplant of a heart from a genetically modified pig into a man with incurable heart disease. Three years later, a woman - Towana Looney - broke records by becoming the first recipient of a pig kidney to live for more than two months.

Faced with a lack of donors, science is now considering transplanting an animal organ into a human. The risks of rejection and infection are among the many scientific challenges to be overcome. Other essential questions arise: Where is the ethical limit on manipulating the boundaries between humans and animals? Does the future of xenografts lie in breeding genetically modified pigs, or in growing human organs in pig bodies? What would be the consequences for the pig graft market?

In the USA, over 100,000 patients are currently waiting for an organ transplant. Every day in Europe, 18 patients who are candidates for organ transplants die for lack of donor organs. This scientific investigation reveals the inner workings of these medical advances, with their considerable ethical, human and economic consequences.

In a remote forest in southern Chile, El Gran Abuelo, a 5,000-year-old cypress tree, shares his life story: The land he grew up in, his first encounters with humans, and the constant struggle raging around him.

Today, El Gran Abuelo faces a new threat. The forest industry, supported by the government, is increasingly destroying the tree's ecosystem, also erasing the entire cultural history of the Mapuche people.

But a recent discovery could change everything... Jonathan Barichivich, a young scientist of Mapuche origin, has just revealed that El Gran Abuelo was the world's oldest tree. And no one knows how it was able to reach such an advanced age! According to Jonathan, it could be the key to saving trees from ecological upheavals. Will this ancient tree, a true symbol of resilience and adaptability, survive the ever-increasing pressure that humans exert on nature?



The harpy eagle is one of the largest and most powerful raptors in the South American rainforest. Christine Morrier, a renowned zoologist, travels to Ecuador to meet Ruth Muñiz, a leading specialist in birds of prey. Who would have thought that Alpine marmots, those sweet bundles of fluff, had a penchant for killing each other with teeth and stones? Yet this is precisely what unfolds in the breathtaking, though far from peaceful, Alpine landscapes where, for thousands of years, marmots have waged a ruthless clan war. Duels, beheadings, infanticide, adultery... These rodents will stop at nothing to assert their dominance over a burrow and its surrounding territory!

But today, with the acceleration of climate change, internecine conflicts are erupting within the clans themselves - threatening the very survival of this iconic Alpine species.

In a protected reserve at the heart of the Vanoise National Park, researchers are closely monitoring the rivalries that have pitted these fierce warriors against each other for generations. This documentary takes us deep into the world of the Alpine marmot - a paradoxical animal, as endearing as it is ferocious - while raising urgent questions about the future of the species in a rapidly changing environment.

AN INDIGENOUS LEADER'S FIGHT TO SAVE THE AMAZON

In November 2025, at COP30 in Belém, the last great Kayapo chief Raoni Metuktire raised his voice once more against the dangers facing the Amazon rainforest and its peoples.

In Brazil, where deforestation advances at a brutal pace, the Xingu reserve still endures. As vast as the state of Florida, it shelters unique biodiversity and a mosaic of Indigenous cultures. For generations, the Kayapo have defended this land with all their strength. For the past 50 years, Raoni has been the voice of their struggle. He has traveled the world to sound the alarm about a catastrophe the West long refused to acknowledge. Able to unite Indigenous peoples and engage with the world's powerful leaders, he has become a symbol of awakening to a crisis that is urgent and undeniable. Today, a new generation of Kayapo activists is taking up the torch by fighting fires, guarding the forest's borders, and engaging in an increasingly strategic political struggle. Their presence on the ground continues Raoni's fight and shows that resistance will not disappear with him.

This film will follow the Amazonian chief on a final journey across the Xingu River, to the Kuarup, a sacred ceremony honoring the spirits of the ancestors. Imagined as a visual and sensory odyssey - blending immersive footage, rare archival material, and Kayapo myths - it tells the story of Raoni's life and his fight to protect the living world, carrying his voice into the tumult of our times.
